Consultation on expansion at Trinity School

Introduction

Trinity School together with the Governing Body of the Newbury Academy Trust is seeking the views of parents, staff and other stakeholders on a proposal to permanently increase the intake from 187 students (Six form entry) to 210 students (Seven form entry) from September 2020. This document is part of a four-week consultation process, which opens on Wednesday 11th March and closes on Wednesday 8th April. At the end of the consultation period, a decision will be taken on whether to make the changes described below.

Proposal

Trinity School currently has an admissions number of 187 students. The school would like to provide additional places for young people in our community from September 2020 so that local families can benefit by having access to a school within their local setting. It is therefore proposed to permanently change the number of admissions to 210 students.

What happens next?

The consultation stage closes on Wednesday 8th April. A report summarising the responses received to the consultation will be submitted to the Children, Young People and Education Cabinet Committee at their meeting in June 2020. The Cabinet Member for Education and Health Reform will then decide whether to proceed with the change of age range and publish statutory proposals in the form of a public notice. The public notice would be published in a local newspaper and for a period of four weeks following the

publication date any person can comment on the proposals. Having taken into account any responses, the Cabinet Member will then take a final decision on whether to proceed with the proposal. Please note that if this proposed change of age range to the school goes ahead, it will not affect the determined admission arrangements for entry.
